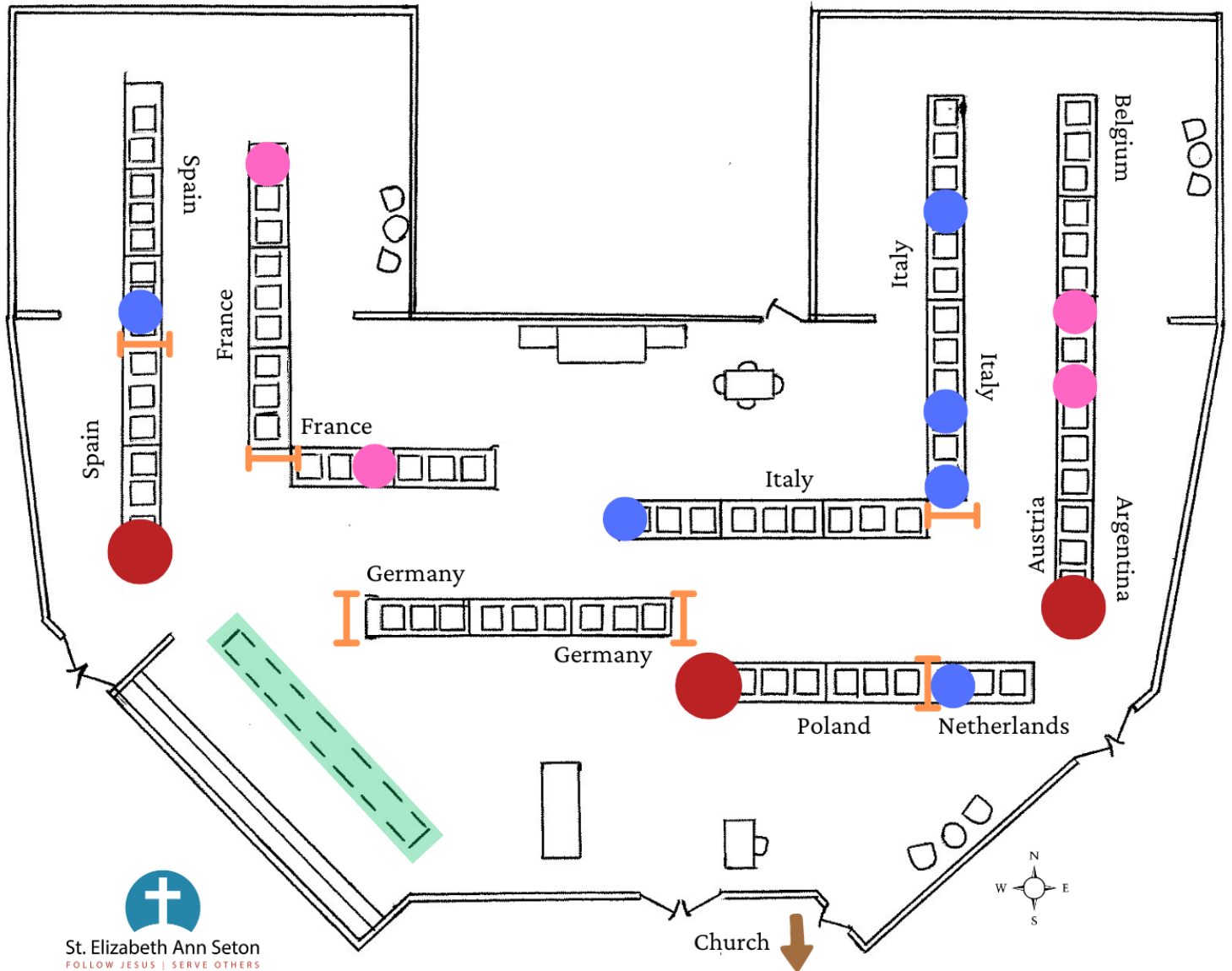


Eucharistic Miracles of the World

Elements of Eucharistic Celebration

These are sacred vessels used to hold or present the Blessed Sacrament. You will find items used here at Seton such as the **monstrance** chalice, **ciborium**, **pyx**, lavabo bowl, and many more.



FAQS

- Q** How should I look at the Exhibit?
- A** There are countless ways to experience! Some ideas are by country, miracles for families and children, mary and the eucharist, or wherever you feel called.

- Q** Do I need to look at all the Miracles?
- A** No, you do not need to see all of the Miracles; view the Exhibit in any order and any time amount you desire.

- Q** When will Blessed Carlo Acutis be canonized?
- A** Pope Francis and a group of cardinals approved Bl. Carlo for canonization in May 2024. He will likely be proclaimed a saint in 2025, during the church's jubilee year.

- Q** Did Carlo do all the work on the panels?
- A** Over a span of 2-and-a-half years, Carlo documented 187 Eucharistic Miracles. He created and designed a website for the work to foster awareness of the Blessed Sacrament.
